## STOCK FARM TRACTORS

The Topsfield Fair will again sponsor a stock farm tractor pull this year for Essex County residents. The pull will be held on Friday, October 10th in the Livestock Arena. Starting time: 6:00 P.M.

Stock farm tractors manufactured before January 1, 1968 weighing less than 13,000 lb. and developing less than 115 PTO Hp. are eligible for the pull. There will be ten weight classes.

Pre-registration is not required. Tractors will be formally entered in the pull by "weighing in" on Friday, October 10, 2008.

All interested participants should obtain a copy of the rules and regulations which can be obtained after August 1, 2008 by calling 978/887-5000 between the hours of 9 AM and 4 PM, Monday through Friday.

All tractors must be weighed in by the starting time. Scales will be open for weighing starting at 3:00 PM on October 10, 2008.
