RULES & REGULATIONS

1. **ALL ENTRY FORMS MUST BE RECEIVED BY 5:00 P.M., TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 23, EXCEPT FOR FAMILY GARDEN CONTEST. OUT OF CONSIDERATION FOR OUR CLERKS, PLEASE PREREGISTER YOUR ENTRIES BY MAILING TO THE ADMINISTRATION OFFICE, P.O. BOX 134, TOPSFIELD, MA 01983. Please bring produce to the vegetable building between 5:00 P.M. and 9:00 P.M. on Thursday, October 2. NO ENTRIES ACCEPTED ON FRIDAY OR SATURDAY. THE BUILDING WILL BE CLOSED AT 10 P.M. ALL DISPLAYS MUST BE COMPLETED BY THIS TIME.**
2. All vegetables must be grown, selected and arranged by exhibitors and entered in proper class.
3. Exhibitors should select specimens uniform in size, shape and color, true to type, and of prime table quality (free of rot), washed when necessary.
4. Leave only about one inch of top on plate exhibits of beets, carrots, parsnips, onions, radishes, etc.
5. A desk for making entries with a member of the committee in attendance will be found in the vegetable building for your convenience.
6. No exhibit will be entitled to a prize or other award unless it possesses points of superiority; and no award will be made to unworthy objects, though they may be the only ones of their kind on exhibition.
7. No exhibitor may exhibit more than one entry of the same variety in any class.
8. Special classes will be arranged for any recognized vegetable of merit if there are three entries, or at the discretion of the committee.
9. The correct variety name must be entered with all vegetables to receive prizes.
10. **BUILDING WILL BE LOCKED UNTIL 4:00 P.M. ON TUESDAY, OCTOBER 14. EXHIBITS MUST BE PICKED UP BETWEEN 4:00 & 7:00 P.M. ON TUESDAY, OCTOBER 14TH, or they will be donated to a local food pantry.**
11. Points used in judging the three market pack class: Quality (young and tender), appearance, uniformity, freedom from insect, disease and mechanical injury, and trueness to type.
12. **ENTRY FORMS FOR FOLLOWING DISPLAYS MUST BE IN THE HAND OF THE VEGETABLE CLERK ONE WEEK BEFORE OPENING DAY: Sec. A. Class 2 - 4' x 8'; Sec. HA, Class 1 - 4' x 6'; Class 3 - Family Garden - Largest Circubit.**
13. All exhibitors must be 18 years of age or older.
